"PASSING DOWN TRADITIONS"

The theme for this logo was inspired by family and traditions. Throughout time and many generations our families have passed down so many traditions. As each family grows new traditions are made or the same ones are used, and as our elders move to the next life, it is our responsibility to keep those traditions alive. Whether its spiritual, dancing, or stories, we as the new generation have to pass those down to our kids and them to their kids. When I moved back to Ignacio 5 years ago, my goal was to learn my traditions as a Ute woman, because growing up I didn't get the chance to learn our Ute traditions. I want to learn these things to pass down to my son. so he can pass those down to his kids and so on. When we come together as one people during our Bear Dances, Sundance and Powwows, I see so many beautiful families keeping everything alive, and see the smiles on their faces as they dance or are getting ready to go out and make our elders proud.

This is why I chose to draw the circle of life, because we are one and we keep moving in the right directions. The top left side has 2 elders, 1 man and 1 woman, because that is who we come from, they taught us what we know now. The white section is a woman dancer representing our mothers, aunties, sisters, cousins, who are there for us and make all of our regalia and support us but also dance for our family. The man represents our fathers, uncles, brothers, and cousins who dance for us, as well and keep the strength in our families together. The children represent our new life that is going to pass everything on and usually the first thing they start out with is Bear Dance so they are in their bear dance

regalia. And it all circles back because one day when we get older the cycle repeats. The sweetgrass represents our spirituality in the Creator because we look up to the Creator for everything in times of need, and in thanks, in the life given to us and the opportunity to have our families with us, and to be able to have these traditions that are so important to us.

Powwow Dance Contest Rules

The Powwow Committee has designed the following rules in order to maintain a fair contest.

- 1. Registration, Opens Friday, Sept. 6 at 5 p.m. Closes at 7 p.m., Opens Saturday, Sept. 7 at 12 p.m. and closes at 1 p.m.
- 2. Each contestant must wear the number issued by the Committee. Display your contest number on your **left side** for the duration of the Powwow.
- 3. Each contestant must register in only (1) one dance category and be responsible for participating in all grand entries, exhibitions and dance contest. Once registered, **you cannot switch to another category**.
- 4. Dancers are expected to dress in **FULL** regalia for grand entry.
- 5. At any given time, the Powwow Committee may request a participation dance for any category.
- 6. All Dancers are expected to be ready when called to grand entry, exhibition and contest.
- 7. When a particular dance category is divided into groups, the dancer/contestant is required to compete in their group placement. **Dancing in the wrong group will result in no points received for that session.**
- 8. Banners, crowns and other signs of royalty are not to be worn during the contest, insuring that all dancers are judged by ability rather than popularity.
- 9. The following individuals will not be allowed to compete in any of the contest; The Powwow Head Staff, all Powwow Committee Members and Southern Ute Royalties.
- 10. The rules for judges require that no family member through marriage, blood or adoption shall judge a particular contest, which has a relative competing. IF this happens and is discovered by the Arena Director, Tabulators or Powwow Committee, the dancer will be disqualified for the day. **We advise all dancers to assist in making sure this does not happen to them.**
- 11. There will be no whistle blowing allowed.
- 12. If any major part of the contestant's regalia falls or is dropped during the contest song, they must be disqualified voluntarily. (Dyed hackles are not considered a major part).
- 13. The use of **ALCOHOL OR ILLEGAL DRUGS** during the contest will result in the disqualification of the contestant from all competition.
- 14. The prize money will be released to the announced contestant winner only. The winner will be required to sign for their prize money. If the winner is not present, you will forfeit your money!
- 15. Payments which are \$600 or more, require a W-9 form to be filled out.
- 16. Contest ties will be properly handled. (run-off)
- 17. LOST/OR DISPLACED NUMBERS WILL NOT BE REPLACED.
- 18. ALL DECISIONS OF THE POWWOW COMMITTEE ARE FINAL!!!

Powwow Drumming & Singing Rules

- 1. Registration, Opens Friday, Sept. 6 at 5 p.m. Closes at 7 p.m., Opens Saturday, Sept. 7 at 12 p.m. and closes at 1 p.m. You will not be able to register after the closing time.
- 2. All lead singers must register their drum group and provide all singers names to be eligible for contest monies.
- 3. Lead singers MUST provide the Drum Rules to each drummer.
- 4. Payments which are \$600 or more, require a W-9 form to be filled out.
- 5. Drum groups must set up at the same location each session.
- 6. All singers must be present for drum roll call. There will be a roll call 15 minutes before every grand entry.
- 7. Drum groups must have a minimum of (10) singers.
- 8. Drum hopping will not be allowed.
- o. Drum groups will be judged each day for originality leads, seconds, drumming, harmony, cleanliness and appropriate song.
- 10. Song lengths will be limited as follows. **Drum Judge has discretion to modify**. *Intertribal 6 push-ups; *Contest 4 push-ups; *Grand Entry 4 push-ups.
- 11. Drum rotation will be clockwise for intertribal and counterclockwise for contest songs.
- 12. EXCEPTION Host Drums will sing final contest songs.
- 13. **RESPECT other drums** no drum practice while other drums are performing.
- 14. Any singers suspected of alcohol or drug use, exhibiting inappropriate behavior will cause the drum group to be disqualified for that day. All points will be taken away.
- 15. The rules for judges require that no family member through marriage, blood or adoption shall judge the drum contest which has a relative competing. If this happens and is discovered by the Drum Judge, Arena Director, Tabulators or Powwow Committee, the Drum Group will be disqualified for that session. We advise all drum groups to assist in making sure this does not happen. All points will be taken away.
- 16. Host Drum Groups will not be eligible to compete in the Drum Contest.
- 17. P.A. System will be provided. (Please do not bang or shake the microphone, which has been provided, or you will be held responsible for damages, per contractor).
- 18. ALL DECISIONS OF THE POWWOW COMMITTEE ARE FINAL!!!




